


A blissful escape to Goa

The beaches of North Goa attract vacationers from all over the globe. Many are highly developed with plenty of amenities like beach chairs and showers as well as nearby restaurants and cafes. The following are among Goa's not-to-be-missed beaches and are celebrated for their beauty and exciting water sports.



Calangute Beach

Calangute Beach is the star of Goa, which might be why it's referred to as the 'queen of beaches'. Just a few miles from the capital of Panaji, Calangute Beach is easily accessible and home to a wide array of upscale and budget-friendly hotels. Visitors to the beach enjoy swimming, water skiing, snorkeling, and other water sports. Banana boat rides and sailing excursions to see dolphins are also popular here.

Baga Beach

Located near Calangute Beach, Baga Beach is also a popular tourist destination with its picturesque stretch of coast and exciting water sports. Windsurfing and parasailing are popular pastimes here. Visitors will also find a wealth of restaurants and shops in close proximity to the beach.

Querim Beach

Dona Paula Beach

Anjuna Beach

Old Goa

Located on the banks of the Mandovi River, Old Goa dates to the 15th century, but soon after its founding, it was taken over by the Portuguese and became an important center for the spice trade. Filled with Portuguese Colonial architecture, Old Goa is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.



Chapora Fort

One of the best places to enjoy a Goa sunset, Chapora Fort overlooks the Arabian Sea from its location on the Chapora River. Constructed by Adil Shah in 1510, the historic fort is one of Goa's most visited historic attractions.

Aguada Fort

Aguada Fort juts into the sea near Panjim. This coastal attraction dates to the 17th century and was constructed by the Portuguese. Many visitors pair their fort visit with time at Sinquerim Beach.

Goa State Museum

To learn about Goa, visitors should head to the Goa State Museum, which is home to a substantial collection of regional artifacts and exhibits.

Museum of Christian Art

As one of the only museums of its kind in Asia, Goa's Museum of Christian Art is popular with tourists. It houses collections of paintings, textiles, sculpture, and more.

Basilica of Bom Jesus

The Basilica of Bom Jesus is a major Goa attraction for foreign visitors. The basilica is noted for its Baroque exterior and as a pilgrimage point for Catholics. The basilica holds the remains of St. Xavier and is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

fontainhas

Fontainhas is Goa's popular Latin Quarter. Founded by the Portuguese during the 19th century, the area brims with colonial architecture as well as churches, shops, and restaurants that retain the Portuguese culinary influence.

South Goa Beaches

South Goa beaches are less crowded than the beaches of North Goa, which is precisely their draw for many vacationers. South Goa's beaches are no less beautiful; in fact, they're known for their pristine charm and breathtaking views of the Arabian Sea. The following are among the most celebrated South Goa beaches:



Varca Beach – Varca Beach is known for its postcard-worthy setting. Noted as one of the cleanest beaches in Goa, Varca Beach retains its air of untouched beauty. Its proximity to Benaulim makes it easy to access.

Palolem Beach – Also revered for its unspoilt beauty, Palolem Beach is backed by a lush fringe of palm trees that enhances its aura of paradise. Visitors here enjoy relaxing on the beach and water sports.

Velsao Beach – Although a remote beach, Velsao Beach is worth checking out because of its untouched beauty. Rarely visited by tourists, it's a romantic destination and perfect for travelers who want to avoid crowds.

Mobar Beach – Mobar Beach is well known for its water sports scene, but it's also an area that is rich in biodiversity. Many people enjoy snorkeling and scuba here in order to witness its diverse marine ecosystem.

Cavelossim Beach – Known for its lava rocks, Cavelossim Beach is a picturesque setting where beach goers enjoy relaxing on the sand or visiting its area markets or the Holy Cross Church. Its quiet ambiance is popular with families and couples looking for a relaxing getaway.

Butterfly Beach – Butterfly Beach is best reached by boat, but it's worth the trek. This South Goa beach is named for its resident butterflies. The beach is small and uncrowded. Its idyllic scenery makes it another of Goa's most romantic beaches for couples.

Agonda Beach – Agonda Beach offers visitors to South Goa a more lively experience. Though still lovely and less crowded than many northern beaches, Agonda Beach features many nearby restaurants and hotels. It's also a great place to catch a glimpse of resident Ridley turtles.

Temples and Museums

South Goa is also home to many museums and temples. The following are some of the region's most revered sites:

Mangeshi Temple – Mangeshi Temple boasts stunning architecture with its white tower and colorful adjoining buildings. The site is an important pilgrimage destination for Hindu people as well as a major South Goa tourist attraction. Its annual festival in February is one of the best times to visit.

Shri Damodar Sansthaan Temple – Located quite inland from Goa's coast, the Shri Damodar Sansthaan Temple is, nevertheless, worth trekking to. The temple is located a few miles from the city of Margao. The temple is known for its stunning architecture and festivals.

Big Foot Museum – One of the best-loved museums in Goa, the Big Foot Museum features exhibits–including interactive displays–of rural Goa life. It also features collections of handicrafts and art for sale that are popular with tourists.

Chitra Museum – South Goa's Chitra Museum features more than 4,000 artifacts, including pottery, musical instruments, and more. The museum celebrates the cultural heritage of Goa with its artifacts and exhibits.
