## Day 03 - Delhi - Agra Local Sightseeing



Agra is a city located on the banks of the Yamuna River in Agra district in the Indian state of Uttar Pradesh. Agra is a major tourist destination for its many Mughal period buildings, particularly the Taj Mahal, Agra Fort and Fatehpur Sikri, all of which are UNESCO World Heritage Sites. Another world heritage site of Agra is Agra Fort. It is a major building of Agra, located in the heart of the city. India's oldest Mughal garden, Rambagh, was built by the Mughal emperor Babur in 1528.



## Day 04- Agra - Jaipur



Jaipur's Most Famous, Peakless Temple Of Lord Krishna. It Is Situated In The Central Courtyard Of Jai-Niwas Garden Built To The East Of Chandramahal. The Idol Of The Tutelary Deity Govindji, Previously Installed In The Temple Of Vrindavan, Was Reinstalled Here By Sawai Jai Singh II As His Family Deity. Jaipur Also Called The Pink City Or Pink City, The City Palace Is A Blend Of Rajasthani And Mughal Styles, A Former Royal Residence Located In The Heart Of The Old City. Jantar



## Day 05- Jaipur Local Sightseeing



Jaipur is the capital of India's Rajasthan state. It evokes the royal family that once ruled the region and that, in 1727, founded what is now called the Old City, or "Pink City" for its trademark building color. At the center of its stately street grid (notable in India) stands the opulent, colonnaded City Palace complex. With gardens, Hawa Mahal, Jantar Mantar courtyards and museums, part of it is still a royal residence

The city of Jaipur was founded by the King of Amber, Maharaja Sawai Jai Singh II on 18 November 1727, who ruled from 1699 to 1743. He planned to shift his capital from Amber, 11 kilometers (7 mi) to Jaipur to accommodate the growing population and increasing scarcity of water. Jai Singh consulted several books on architecture and architects while planning the layout of Jaipur. Under the architectural guidance of Vidyadhar Bhattacharya, Jaipur was planned based on the principles of Vastu Shastra and Shilpa Shastra.

#### Day 06- Jaipur - Jodhpur



We visit the Mehrangarh Fort – which stands four hundred feet above the skyline of Jodhpur. The fort is burnished in Red Sandstone and its colossal structure is surely impressive in all manner. Here we will see Moti Mahal – largest room in fort whose ceiling is decorated with Gold Leaves, Sea Shells and Mirrors, Phool Mahal – Pleasure dome of the Maharajas, Sheesh Mahal – Decorative mirror palace with brightly coloured paintings, Silah Khana – place where weapons were stored, Daulat Khana – treasure vault and Rang Mahal. Later we visit Jaswant Thada – a royal cenotaph built in the white marble also known as Taj Mahal of Marwar. We then see the Sanganeri Block Prints Demonstration – a hand-block printing technique originating from Sanganer. Mehrangarh Fort, Moti Mahal, Phool Mahal, Sheesh Mahal, Jaswant Thadda, Toor ji ka Jhalra, Kaylana Lake.
