Manali is a high-altitude Himalayan resort town in India's northern Himachal Pradesh state. It has a reputation as a backpacking center and honeymoon destination. Set on the Beas River, it's a gateway for skiing in the Solang Valley and trekking in Parvati Valley. It's also a jumping-off point for paragliding, rafting and mountaineering in the Pir Panjal mountains, home to 4,000m-high Rohtang Pass. Manali is a town in the Kullu district of Himachal Pradesh, India, located in the Beas River valley. It's known for its cool climate, snow-capped mountains, and forests. Manali is also the starting point of an ancient trade route that goes through Lahul, Ladakh, and Kashmir, and is connected to Spiti by a divergent road. Manali is a popular tourist destination, and is known as a backpacking center and honeymoon destination. It's a staging point for treks, such as Beas Kund and Chandrakhani Pass, and sports, such as white-water rafting. Manali is a year-round destination, but the best time to visit is from October to February to see the snow-covered mountains. From March to June, you can experience the nightlife.







Tosh is a small, picturesque village located in the Parvati Valley of Himachal Pradesh, India, known for its stunning natural beauty and serene atmosphere. It's a popular destination for backpackers, trekkers, and nature lovers, offering breathtaking views of the surrounding mountains. Tosh is also known for its tranquil vibe and is often described as a "traditional village turned hippie colony," with a mix of local culture and a vibrant travel scene. Tosh is situated at an altitude of about 2,400 meters (7,900 feet) on a mountain slope, on the right bank of the Parvati River. It's one of the last villages in the Parvati Valley, accessible after a one-hour hike from Barshaini, the last bus stop. Tosh is surrounded by majestic mountains and offers panoramic views of the Parvati Valley and surrounding peaks. The village's charm lies in its natural beauty, peaceful atmosphere, and proximity to the river.

Day 05 Tosh to Shimla

Shimla is the capital and largest city of the North Indian state of Himachal Pradesh. In 1864, Shimla was declared the summer capital of British India. After independence, the city became the capital of East Punjab and was later made the capital of Himachal Pradesh. It is the major commercial, cultural and educational center

of the state. Small villages were recorded before 1815 when the British army took control of the region. The climatic conditions attracted the British to establish the city in the dense forests of the Himalayas. As the summer capital, Shimla hosted many important political meetings, including the Shimla Delegation of 1906, the Shimla Agreement of 1914 and the Shimla Conference of 1945. Even after independence, the city remained an important political center, hosting the Shimla Agreement of 1972. After the reorganization of the state of Himachal Pradesh, the existing Mahasu district was named Shimla. Shimla has many buildings built in Tudorbethan and neo-Gothic architecture from the colonial era, as well as many temples and churches. The colonial architecture and the city's churches, temples and natural environment attract tourists. The major attractions of the city include Shri Hanuman Jakhu (statue), Jakhu Temple, Viceregal Lodge, Christ Church, Mall Road, The Ridge and Annadale. The northernmost point of the city center is Jakhu and the southernmost point is Annadale, the easternmost point is Sanjauli and the westernmost point is Chota Shimla. The Kalka-Shimla railway line built by the British, which is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is also a major tourist attraction. Due to its steep slopes, Shimla hosts the mountain biking race MTB Himalaya, which began in 2005 and is considered the largest event of its kind in South Asia. Shimla also has the largest natural ice skating rink in South Asia. Apart from being a tourist hub, the city is also an educational hub with several colleges and research institutes



Some places to visit in Kufri: Jakhu Temple: This temple is one of the places to visit for spiritual tourists. The temple houses one of the tallest statues in the world, a figure of the Hindu god Hanuman. Kufri Fun Campus:

This park is equipped with various rides, pools and the world's highest go-kart track. During this period, along with Shimla, there is snowfall in tourist places like Kufri, Nal Dehra, Chail etc.

Kufri city was established by the British in the year 1819. Before this it was under Nepal. It is said that the British used to come here during summer to hunt and get relief
