Kalimpong is a city and the headquarters of an eponymous district in the Indian state of West Bengal. It is located at an average elevation of 1,250 metres (4,101 ft). Kalimpong is known for its educational institutions, many of which were established during the British colonial period. It used to be a gateway for trade between Tibet and India before China's occupation of Tibet and the Sino-Indian War. Kalimpong and neighbouring Darjeeling were major centres for demands for a separate Gorkhaland state in the 1980s and as recently as 2010.

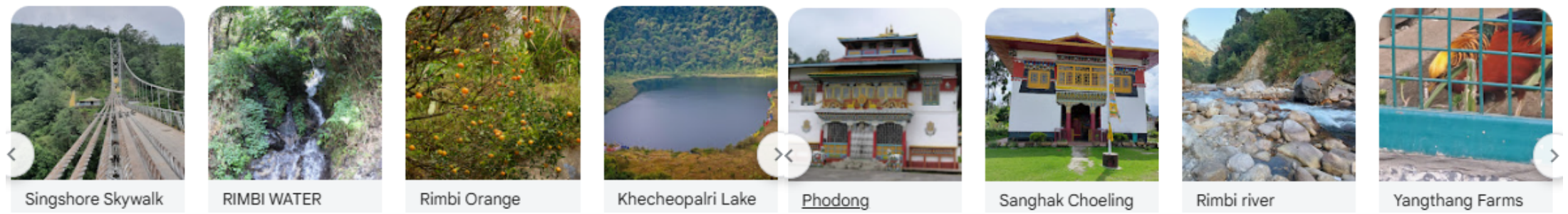

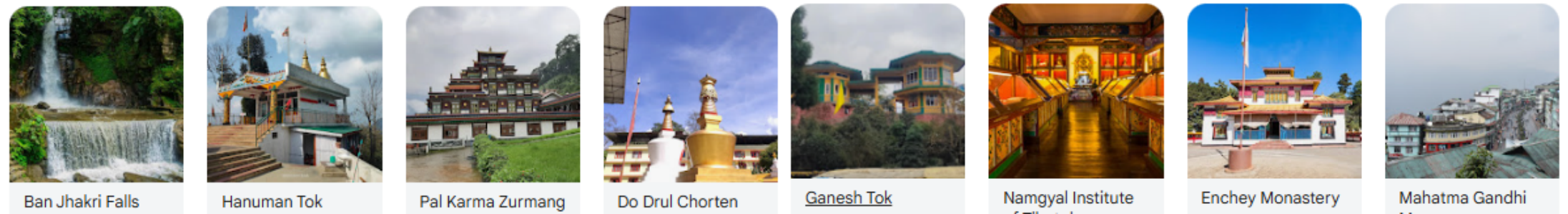

There are many places worth visiting here like Ganesh Tok, Hanuman Tok and Tashi View Point. If you want to enjoy Gangtok to the fullest, then explore this city on foot. The view of Kanchenjunga from here looks very attractive. On seeing it, it seems as if this mountain is touching the sky and is changing its color every moment. If you are interested in Buddhism, then you must visit the Institute of Tibetology. Priceless ancient relics and scriptures related to Buddhism are kept here. Tibetan language,

culture, philosophy and literature are taught separately here. Apart from all this, you can also visit Purana Bazar, Lal Bazar or Naya Bazar for ancient artifacts.



Day 06 Gangtok Explore

Gangtok, city, capital of Sikkim state, northeastern India. It lies at an elevation of about 5,600 feet (1,700 metres) on a tributary of the Tista River in the southeast-central part of the state. The city’s name means “hilltop.” Gangtok is situated on slopes rich in corn (maize). It was the government seat of the state of Sikkim until the monarchy was abolished (1975) and Sikkim was incorporated into India (1976). The city’s population includes Nepalese, Tibetans, Lepchas, and Indians. In the early 21st century several communities surrounding Gangtok were administratively merged under the Gangtok Municipal Corporation, greatly increasing the city’s area and its population. Gangtok serves as a market centre for maize, rice, pulses, and oranges. It was an important point on the Indo-Tibetan trade route through the Nathu Pass (Nathu-la), 13 miles (21 km) to the northeast, until the border with Tibet (China) was closed in 1962. However, the pass was reopened for trade in 2006. The North Sikkim Highway (1962) from Gangtok reaches the Tibetan border areas via Lachung and Lachen, and the national highway leads southwest to India.

Lachung is a town and hill station in the Mangan district of the northeastern Indian state of Sikkim. It is about 50 kilometres from the town of Mangan, which is the district headquarters. It is located in Mangan district near the border with Tibet. Lachung is at an elevation of about 9,600 feet (2,900 m) and is at the confluence of the Lachen and Lachung rivers, both tributaries of the Teesta River. The word Lachung means "small pass". The town is about 125 kilometres (78 mi) from the capital, Gangtok.

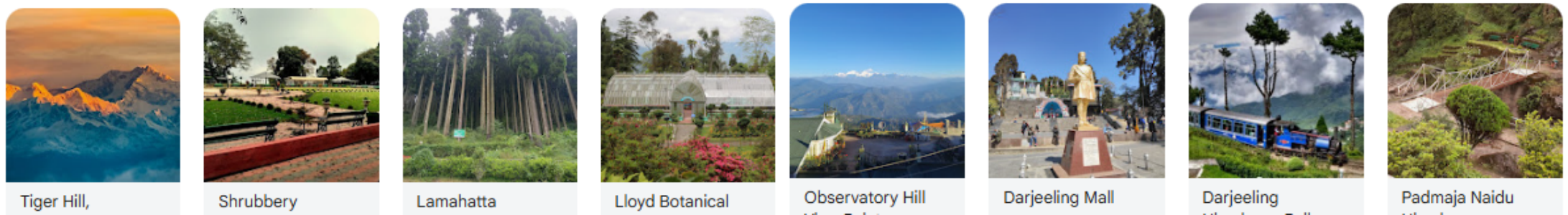

In clear weather, visitors can enjoy spectacular views of Kanchenjunga, the world's third-highest mountain. The city retains a certain colonial charm with its architecture and history. Darjeeling is rich in cultural and natural heritage, with a wide variety of attractions and activities. Darjeeling is home to a variety of wildlife, including the Himalayan flying squirrel, Assam macaque, and Indian leopard. Other popular attractions include the Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park, the Batasia Loop, and the Japanese Peace Pagoda. Darjeeling was once a sanitarium for British soldiers and administrators and was known as the "Queen of the Hills." The British East India Company turned the Darjeeling area into a hill station in the 1800s. The name "Darjeeling" is derived from the Tibetan words "dorje" (vajra) and "ling" (place), meaning "Land of the Vajra".
